- I. A vanity unit with an eye-catching skirt made from Beata Heuman's cotton-mix 'Marbleized Velvet', white honed marble surfaces, pink walls and shell-style wall lights have been combined in this loo by the designer to create a decorated and feminine feel. beataheuman.com
- 4. Cupboards, faced with panels of aged leather, have been paired with uplifting yellow zellige tiles from Emery & Cie in this bathroom by Maria Speake of Retrouvius. Salvaged materials are a great way to add character to a space that might otherwise feel clinical. retrouvius.com
- 2. Max Lamb's 'Marmoreal' terrazzo tiles from Dzek are a good way to add colour without committing to one shade. In this bathroom by Carter Design, they have been used to provide a bright decorative contrast with the plain white bath and wooden surround. carterdesignco.com
- 5. This bold, colour-blocked bathroom by Marcante Testa cleverly combines shades and shapes. The walls, painted half coral and half mint green, complement the minimalist basin unit and matt black floor. The glass screen acts as a subtly effective divider. marcante-testa.it
- 3. This statement bathroom by design duo the Campana Brothers is as practical as it is dramatic, with the floor, walls and ceiling all covered in red mosaic tiles from Bisazza. A freestanding vanity and sink, from Antonio Lupi, keep the space simple and unfussy. campanas.com.br
